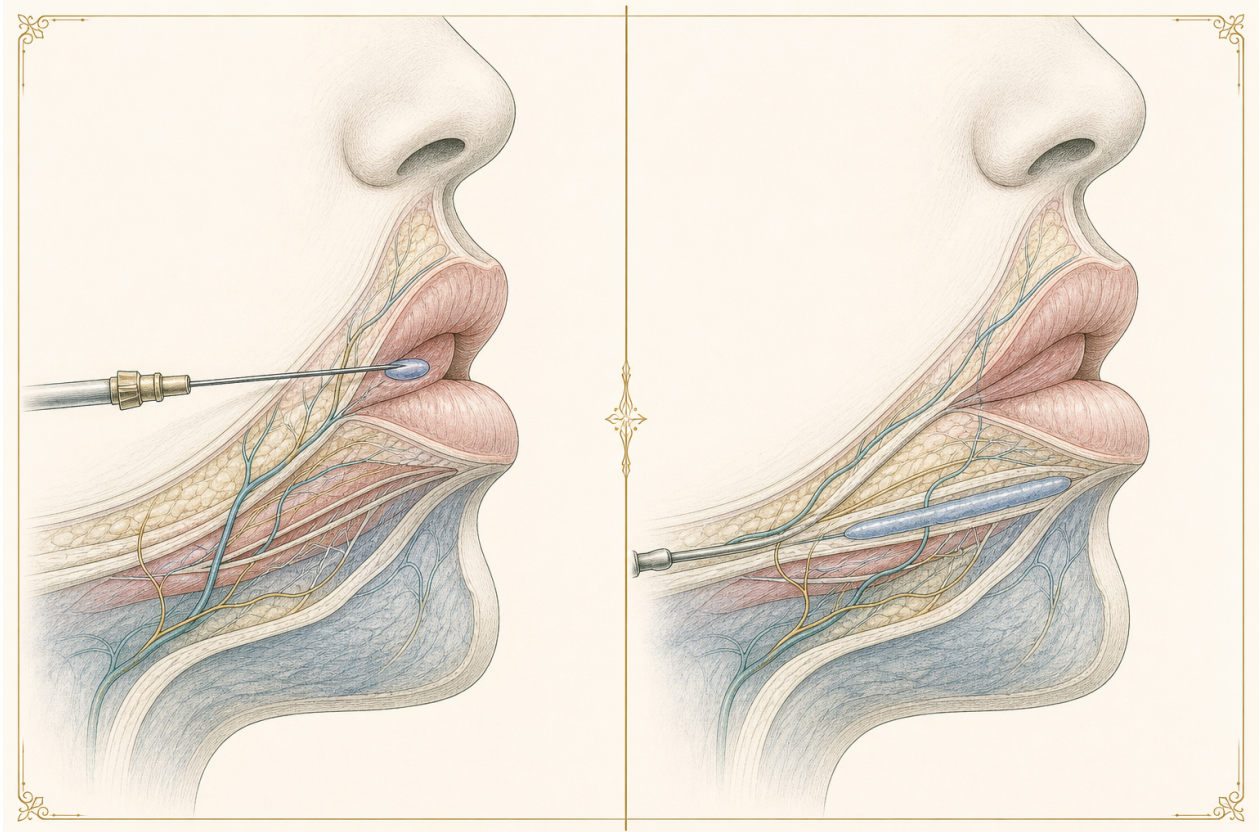


Needle versus cannula

Compare a sharp needle with a blunt-ended flexible cannula and understand why a treatment plan may use either or both.



What it means

A needle creates a precise entry and can place very small amounts of product directly. A cannula usually enters through a pilot hole and can travel through a tissue plane from fewer entry points. Neither tool removes vascular risk.

Important limit

A cannula is not 'risk free', and a needle is not automatically inferior. Anatomy knowledge, plane, product, dose and emergency planning matter more than a marketing label.

Needle versus cannula

A useful home-care foundation

- Disclose previous filler
- Plan around important events
- Follow bruising and swelling advice
- Know urgent vascular warning signs

Pause and seek appropriate review when

- Active skin infection
- Unexplained swelling
- Dental or medical issue affecting timing
- Unrealistic or coercive treatment goals
